General Rules & Regulations

1. This Society shall called "Trawden & District Agricultural Society"
2. The Directors of the Society shall consist of Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, Treasurer and General Secretary.
3. The Officers of the Society shall consist of President, Chairman, Vice Chairman, Treasurer, General Secretary, Show Manager and Committee; Five to form a quorum.
4. All Directors and Officers shall be elected annually at the General meeting of the Society, which shall be held on such a day and at such a place as the Society may appoint.
5. The affairs of the Society and the application of its funds shall be under the management of the Committee, who will settle all matters that may be in dispute.
6. The Society reserves the right to cancel or amalgamate any class with insufficient entries.
7. All exhibitors do so subject to the Rules and Regulations laid down by the Society. If a dispute arises for which no special rule is laid down, same shall be referred to the Directors and Officers, whose decision shall be final.
8. Show Secretaries shall not in any way disclose or make known to any person whatsoever, until the day of the show, the names of the competitors for any prizes.
9. All exhibits are displayed at Owners Risk. The Society will accept no responsibility for loss, damage, accident of theft.
10. Prize winning stock to be paraded when called upon, or forfeit prize money and/or trophy.
11. All entries to be presented at times stated by Section Secretary.
12. Any Exhibitors Assistant not in possession of an Entrance Ticket must pay the full admission fee.
13. All persons attending the Show do so at their own risk. The Society cannot be made liable for personal accident or liability or damage to vehicles or property.
14. Livestock exhibited at the Show must have been the bone-fide property of the exhibitor for at least two calendar months previous to the show date.
15. Secretaries and Stewards of each section will establish eligibility of any entry in that section.
16. Trophies to be held for one year unless otherwise stated. Winners are responsible for the care of the trophy during this term and for its safe return to the Society before the next show.
17. **Parking regulations must be observed. The Society has the right to remove any vehicle which is considered an obstruction in any way or is moving on the showground between 10:00am and 5pm.**

SIX DAY STANDSTILL EXEMPTION FOR SHOW ANIMALS

Defra announced today that an exemption would be granted to the six day standstill for individually identified cattle, sheep and goats attending shows.

VEHICLES ON THE SHOW GROUND**

Show cattle, sheep and goats will be able to claim the exemption provided that they have been isolated from all other non-show animals on their resident holding in Defra-approved isolation facilities for six days before attending the first show. Thereafter they may move from show to show without triggering a standstill. They may return to their farm of origin between shows and move to a further show within six days provided that they are kept in approved isolation facilities on the farm. On final return to the farm, they must be kept in approved isolation facilities for six days, or trigger a six day standstill on that holding. An entire holding may be approved as an isolation facility if it is a single parcel of land which meets the separation criteria.

Cattle sheep and goats going to shows from a premises where no suitable isolation facilities exist will have to:

- Observe a six day whole farm standstill before they go to the first show.
- Trigger a six day standstill on the whole farm when they return from any show.
- Be individually identified. They may return to their farm of origin between shows and move to a further show after six days provided that there are no other movements onto the holding concerned.

All show animals will have to be inspected by a veterinary surgeon on arrival at a showground before they mingle with other animals.

For all cattle, sheep and goats that are sold at a show the six day standstill will apply at the premises of destination. No other animal will be able to move from those premises for six days.

Movements to and from shows will have to be reported in line with the requirements of the general movement licence issued under the Disease Control (Interim Measures) (England) Order 2003.

At the show, these passports should be handed to the Secretary or Steward in charge who will sign on behalf of the show. Exhibitors should then complete a second movement summary to show that the animal has returned to their farm. **PLEASE MAKE SURE YOU HAVE SUFFICIENT MOVEMENT CARDS IN THE PASSPORT.**
2. All exhibitors must comply fully with all bio-security measures as required by DEFRA.
3. All Exhibitors must have third party public liability insurance.
4. Cows/heifers calving at the Show or showing abnormal discharge or which appear to be about to abort, must be reported to the Veterinary Officer and returned to herd of origin immediately. All charges incurred must be paid for by the exhibitor.
5. Bulls over 10 months must be rung and led by a staff or two competent leaders, as per Health & Safety Executive Notes of Guidance.
6. There will be limited cover available for cattle on show day, straw is not provided.

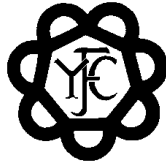
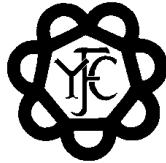
